Care from the inside out.

Our agency was founded on the commitment to help our team feel cared for, free to have fun, and able to be open and honest. It not only creates a better working environment, but when our people have the right support, our clients will in turn get the right support.

In 2025/26 we invested in:

- **Carecoins:** We reinvested and increased our 'coin pot' for the confidential therapy services accessed via phone, in-person or on video call, adding to the already established benefit-in-kind access to Vitality private healthcare
- **Mental health first aiders:** Two new employees trained in the FAQ L2 Adult Mental Health: Workplace Responder Qualification
- **Keeping it social:** A packed schedule of socials to help 'decompress' as a team and build stronger bonds outside the office. Apart from our company away days and the Christmas party, we increased our social budget to £1,000
- **Established our 'Guide to Growth':** A new behavioural framework providing a shared language for growth, performance and culture that guides the line management process
- **Transformed training:** Redeveloped the internal and external training plan and launched micro-mentoring to support our existing mentoring scheme
- Became an **accredited Living Wage Employer**

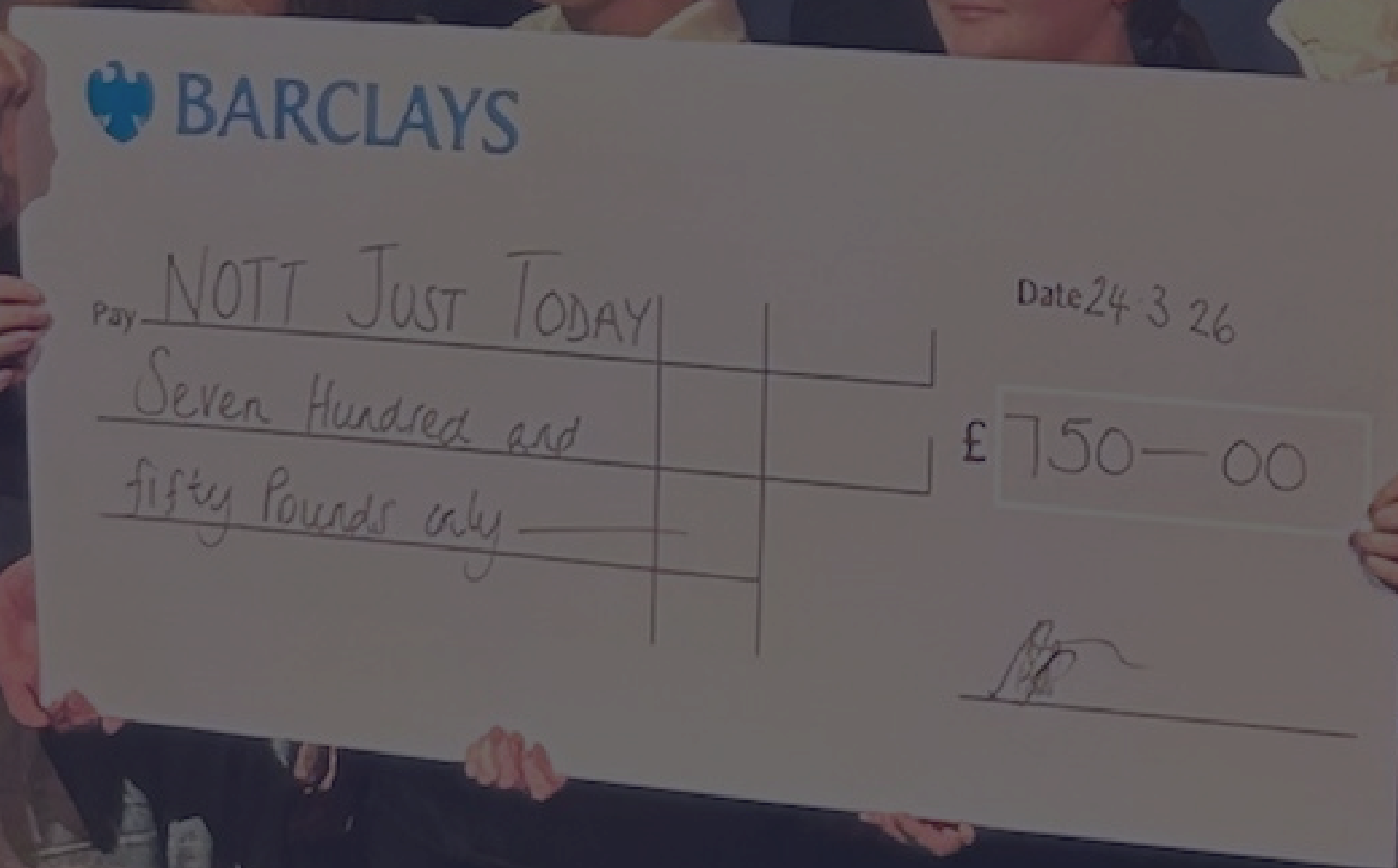

Sustainable changes.

We are constantly working to reduce our environmental impact and 2025 saw our greatest investment yet, including:

Investing in solar:

Using our Nottingham HQ to generate its own renewable energy while utilising shared working spaces with high sustainable credentials. We invested £15,795 in solar panels, which have generated.

Every day office swaps:

Reusing and refilling weekly office items, including soaps, and switching to a local coffee bean brand with donations made to our partner charity Switch Up for every purchase.
